Dear Partners and Friends

I hope this message finds you well. I am writing to you during an urgent and critical time as the situation in Lebanon deteriorates due to ongoing conflict. The humanitarian crisis has escalated dramatically, leaving over 2.2 million people in desperate need of assistance. Among them are 1.3 million Syrian refugees, 119,000 Palestinian refugees, and 87,000 migrants who have already faced tremendous hardships.

The impact of the violence is staggering, with over 2,000 lives lost and more than 10,000 individuals injured. Tragically, the toll includes over 80 health workers killed and 80 injured while attempting to provide care to the wounded. Essential infrastructure has been severely damaged, with 25 health centers attacked—21 in the south and 4 in Beirut—resulting in two centers ceasing operations.

As families flee from the south and Beirut in search of safety, many have sought refuge in schools and on the streets, with little more than the clothes on their backs. The overwhelming majority, displaced from camps in the south and Beirut, are moving to northern regions in hopes of finding a safer environment. Unfortunately, the conditions are dire; many are living outdoors or in overcrowded shelters without basic necessities such as mattresses, blankets, food, or even tents. As the fall season approaches, they face the harsh reality of rain and cold weather without adequate shelter.

The economic crisis in Lebanon further compounds these challenges. Although schools have been opened to provide temporary refuge, essential supplies are scarce. Most aid is coming from NGOs and limited support from organizations like UNRWA, to displaced families at schools but it is simply not enough to meet the vast needs. Everyday items that once were affordable have become prohibitively expensive; for instance, a mattress that cost \$7 has skyrocketed to \$30, while food prices have similarly surged. Many fear that a complete siege could ensue, exacerbating an already desperate situation.

As for the latest statistics done in camps where people were displaced:

1- Naher el Bared has around 1605 families that sought home with their relatives and around 491 families in shelters (UNRWA schools)

2- Beddawi camp there is around 1188 families displaced that sought refuge with their relatives or took homes as UNRWA did not open schools

3- Mar Elias camps there is around 130 families where they sought refuge in their relatives' house as no shelters are available

4- Ein el Helweh camp around 1095 families they sought refuge in their relative homes

5- Al Rachides, Bourj Shamali, al Bus, Bourj el Barajneh and Shatila camp are not as safe so many people flee from them for a safer destination to north camps and Saida camp as some people in Bourj el Barajneh camp at night run to the sea for a less terrifying night as the bombarding is around them and they are also scared that the houses they are in will fall down from the severity of the bombs on Beirut

6- Mieh w Meih camp has around 200 displaced families

Your support has always been invaluable, and in these troubling times, we must lean on the generosity of our friends to continue our efforts. Together, we can provide immediate relief to those suffering—distributing food, medical supplies, and basic hygiene items to families in crisis.

Essential needs to help support displaced families that are not receiving any support and are at their relative home:

1. Food parcels
2. Mattress
3. Mattress covers
4. Pillows
5. Blankets
6. Hygiene kits
7. Women hygiene kits
8. Personal hygiene kits (shampoo, tooth brushes etc.)
9. Clothes (shirts pants socks underwear etc.)
10. Adult diapers
11. Child diapers
12. Baby formula
13. Towels
